Minister of Works Opens 4th Annual Conference, “Business Success through Project management – Best Practices for the 21st Century”

Our very successful Annual Conference which was held on Sept 18th – 19th, 2007 at the Centre of Excellence, provided the opportunity for many PMISCC members to present papers demonstrating our professional capacity, knowledge and best practices to local and foreign attendees. The conference was opened by Minister of Works, Honorable Colm Imbert. This was followed by two eminent feature speakers, John Schmitt and Steven Rollins.

On the morning of Tuesday, Sept. 18th, Andrew Gurbaxani addressed the delegates on the topic of “Measuring Global Project Performance and Value in a State Enterprise”. That afternoon, Lee Brennan spoke on “Project Budgeting using the Project Management Knowledge Areas.” Finally, on the morning of Wednesday, Sept. 19, Trevor Jackson presented, “Creating and Sustaining a Successful Project Management Office.” The 2-day conference was well attended, with approximately 350 delegates present, greatly exceeding the anticipated attendance of 200.

More than 50 attendees attended from overseas including delegates from Europe - Czech Republic in particular as well as Asia – Korea. There were several delegates from neighboring South America – Argentina as well as other parts of the Caribbean, including Barbados and Jamaica. There was a balanced mix of local and foreign presenters. Approximately, half of the presenters (12 of the 26) were from abroad, with the US contributing the largest foreign contingent (8 of the 12). The Atlanta Chapter had the largest presence for a PMI-based chapter (the 3 speakers as noted above).

PMISCC Report on the Annual Region 14 Leadership Conference June 22-23, 2007, South Beach Florida.

ATTENDEESS

The South Florida Chapter hosted the Annual Region 14 Leadership Conference on June 22-23, 2007 in South Beach Florida. **The PMISCC was represented at the meeting by our President, Michael Charles and VP Finance, Suzanne Hydal-Bridgemohansingh.**

The Attendees comprised Board Members from several Chapters belonging to the Region 14 grouping, including:

The broad spectrum of attendees, guest speakers and presenters and their experiences made it a fantastic opportunity for information sharing, networking and exchange of ideas on the promotion of project management as a discipline and as a profession in the community and worldwide. It should be noted that PMI has divided its chapter groupings worldwide into fourteen (14) regions. The PMISCC belongs Region 14. The Region 14 Manager is John Schmitt.

CONFERENCE CONTENT

The conference and events spanned over a 2-day period. The Key note Speakers was Tidwell, CEO, Red Cross, Florida. His presentation was significant since he focused on the management of a not-for-profit institution (red Cross) expanding its services, growing its volunteer based, and offering quality services to the community on a timely and efficient basis. There were server lessons to be learnt for the PMI chapter Leadership who have similar challenges as the Red Cross Organization.

Other papers presented included:

1. PMI Standard for Portfolio Management
2. Governance as Leadership
3. Managing Culture in a Project World
4. Volunteer Leadership and Outreach Programme
5. How Chapters could work with SIGs.

There was also a breakout session for discussion and sharing of ideas among Chapter Board Member with respect to (i) what chapters do well; (ii) Lessons Learned; (iii) What chapter would like to do – strategies. This was discussed for Chapter Finance, Membership, Marketing/Communications and Professional Development.

LEARNINGS

Several messages and ideas came out from the 2 days of discussion, presentations and networking opportunities. In particular, the following should be noted for PMISCC's consideration.

1. To expand the work of the PMISCC, change the constitution to include Directors on the Board. Several Chapters have Vice Presidents and Directors under them.
2. Conduct Outreach Programmes in schools across Trinidad (A-level age). Presently an initiative by the South Florida Chapter.
3. Develop PR packages of information about PMISCC to newcomers at our technical sessions and events to encourage membership.
4. Use ice breakers at our technical sessions to make it more lively and appealing to the younger and new members of PMISCC
5. To further attract our younger members, hold events for membership that are non-technical in nature ("just for fun").
6. Assist other islands to develop Chapters or have satellite or sub group chapters of PMISCC
7. Look into the possibility of using an on-line financial programme called Quick Pro to make the accounting programme more accessible to the President etc.

CONCLUSION

There was much value to be gained by attending the Region 14 Leadership Conference. PMISCC needs to keep up the relations and keep the lines on communication open with the members of the Regional 14 group. In particular, the South Florida Chapter, who has won several awards for best PMI Chapter, is a very dynamic chapter, and they have extended an invitation to PMISCC to attend some of their strategy sessions.

Several other Chapters and groups that we met, including PM Solutions have expressed a strong interest in presenting at PMISCC events and future conferences. It is therefore important that we keep a very close alliance with this valuable network of professionals and Chapter Leaders in order to raise the professional image and standard of our organization.

Training and Education News

Is This Credential Right For Me - PgMPSM

Program Management Professional (PgMPSM)

PMI's newest credential is specifically developed to acknowledge the qualifications of the professional who leads the coordinated management of multiple projects and ensures the ultimate success of a program. You will benefit from the many advantages of this new designation.

Candidates who earn this credential will be internationally recognized as professionals with the knowledge and experience to make and implement the important decisions and accomplish the strategic objectives that enhance business results.

Candidates wishing to pursue this new credential must meet specific eligibility requirements and agree to adhere to a code of professional conduct. Candidates' competence will be evaluated through a sequence of assessments:

- The initial assessment of competence occurs through the application process. Prior to a candidate becoming eligible to pursue this credential they will be evaluated through an extensive application process including review of education by PMI staff and review of professional work experience by a panel of program managers.
- The next step of competence assessment occurs with the multiple-choice exam in which candidates will be called upon to demonstrate their ability to apply their knowledge to a variety of situational or scenario-based questions.
- The last competence assessment occurs through a multi-rater assessment in which a team of raters that the candidate selects will evaluate the candidate's competence in a work environment to perform germane tasks of a program manager as defined through the examination specification.

Eligibility Criteria

With Baccalaureate Degree or the Global Equivalent over the last 15 consecutive years, candidate must have at least:

- Four years of project management experience, and
- Four years of program management experience.

Without Baccalaureate Degree or the Global Equivalent Over the last 15 consecutive years, candidate must have at least:

- Four years of project management experience, and
- Seven years of program management experience.

Candidates who have obtained degrees from a University that has been accredited by PMI through the Global Accreditation Center program will receive a 1,500 hour reduction in the amount of program management experience required for eligibility.

The PMISCC is in the process of making application to PMI to have the Program Management Professional launched in the Caribbean Region in 2008.

On receipt of all relevant information from PMI, the criteria for conducting training for the PgPM will be disseminated to all Education Providers.

In addition, the PMISCC will be negotiating with PMI to be the **Region's Competence Assessment Raters** for this certification and also to ensure that The University of the West Indies is accredited by PMI.

PMP Examination & Recertification

There are over fifty (50) members who have not been recertified. It also appears that some names have dropped off our listing, indicating that members are not paying their membership dues. Members are strongly requested to pay their membership subscription to stay current.

All PMPs are requested to lodge their PDUs in a timely manner (see guide published previously) and recertify their PMP status. Apart from having the requisite PDUs, PMPs must also and submit the recertification form with their payment of US\$150.00.

Members should also note that after the stipulated 'grace period' for recertification, if the member is non-compliant, his/her name is struck off PMI's listing of PMPs. Also based on PMI's Code of Professional Conduct, they will not be allowed to use the PMP accreditation. Being struck off the list means having to do over the PMP examination!

PMPs who have to recertify by December 2007, should first log onto customercare@pmi.org and advise of their PMI membership ID, PMP certification number and that they have logged the necessary PDU's. PMI will then verify that the data is correct and then direct you to log onto www.pmi.org/certapp/ where you will find an authorized link to either recertify online or access to the required recertification Form for Fax purposes.

Maintaining Your Project management Professional (PMP)

Introduction

This document is not meant in any way to replace the Continuing Certificate Requirement (CCR) Handbook nor intended to endorse or promote any company, product, individual or website. This document is meant to act as a guide, to help Project Management Professionals (PMP®) find and identify ways in which to maintain their credential. Please refer to the CCR handbook for detailed information on maintaining the PMP credential. The hand book can be found on the Project Management Institute (PMI®) website¹.

Overview

Obtaining the PMP credentials demonstrate an individual's commitment to the profession of project management. PMPs need to stay abreast of the latest trends in project management and they can do so by actively following the PMIs website. PMIs website is always full of up to date information on what is going on in the Project Management world. Being a member of PMI also gives you more information and access to resources than you can imagine.

PMPs should be aware that they need to accumulate sixty (60) Professional Development Units (PDUs) **after obtaining the PMP credential**. How long do you have to accumulate 60 PDUs? You have three (3) years in which to accumulate 60 PDUs. What is the penalty for not accumulating your PDUs? If you do not obtain 60 PDUs you will need to sit the PMP exam again! Obtaining PDUs is as easy as reporting them. The following section briefly explains.

Accumulating PDUs

PDUs can be reported online. If you are a PMP credential holder the relevant pages will be available to you when you log on. Simple isn't it?

What is a PDU? A PDU "is a measuring unit to quantify approved learning and professional service activities." One (1) hour of an activity is equal to one (1) PDU

PDU Activities

When reporting PDU activities they should fall under the following categories

Category 1: Formal Academic Education

For example a course related to project management in a degree or masters programme.

Category 2: Professional Activities and Self- Directed Learning

(Please refer to the CCR Handbook Page 6 for detailed breakdown of category 2. There is a limit to the number of PDUs you can accumulate in this category)

PMPs can accumulate PDUs from this category by

- Being a practitioner of Project Management
- Participating in self directed learning activities. For example doing personally conducted research or study in project management.

- Being the author or co-author of an article or text book
- Being a speaker/teacher on project management topics
- Being a developer of content for a structured project management learning program

Category 2 may be the easiest way PMPs can accumulate PDUs

PMPs can accumulate PDUs from this category by

- Being the author or co-author of an article or text book
- Being a speaker/teacher on project management topics
- Being a developer of content for a structured project management learning program
- Being a practitioner of Project Management
- Participating in self directed learning activities. For example doing personally conducted research or study in project management.

Category 3: PMI Registered Education Providers (R.E.P)/PMI Components

PDUs can be accumulated in this category by attending educational programmes offered by R.E.Ps

Category 4: Other Provider

PDUs can be accumulated in this category by attending relevant educational programmes offered by non R.E.Ps.

Category 5: Volunteer Service to Professional or Community Organizations

Activities to Accumulate PDUs

Special Interest Groups (SIGs)

Get involved in SIGs. They often offer webinars, some of which are free and some you need to pay a minimum cost. The cost of some webinar is as low as \$5.00USD.

SIGs often have a lot of volunteer opportunity that will also help you to accumulate PDUs

Volunteer opportunities can include:

- Submitting articles
- Submitting book reviews
- Serving on the board
- Speaking at conferences

Chapters

Check out what your local chapter¹ is doing or what other chapters¹ are doing.

Chapters often have meetings and other seminar that offer PDUs. It is also a good way to network.

Archived Webinar Trial

PMISCC is in the process of partnering with PMI Metric Special Interest Group (MetSIG, <http://www.metsig.org/>) to provide content to the membership; this includes individual members and as well as organizations. MetSIG is a Special Interest Group of PMI whose focus is to bring best practices metrics for the management of projects. This group is chaired by Mr. Steve Rollins who is well written, lectured and known in the Project Management world. Mr. Rollins was the keynote speaker at PMISCC's 4th International Conference in Trinidad earlier this year.

This is a breakthrough approach in assisting organizations and their project management community to utilize these metric learnings for business and professional benefit. The delivery of the content is via archived webinars over the Internet that are available anywhere in the world. Now members who did not have the opportunity, especially our members from the islands, can now easily gain PDUs to maintain their certifications through this easy access to do so while increasing their project management knowledge.

In the first instance, archived webinars (28) would be available from the 2007 MetSIG Congress that was completed in April 2007 with presentations from the world over including Australia, Columbia South America, India and Iran. It is expected that the 2008 MetSIG Congress alone would generate over 300 webinars in April 2008, with collaboration from many PMI Specific Interest Groups and local chapters the world over which would also become available to you.

During the trial, for each individual member, this archived webinar would be free and worth 1PDU from your PMISCC Chapter. Once the trial is completed, further information would be provided regarding individual access.

Presently, for organizations seeking to provide free access to their workforce, a promotional code is provided for a small fee. Organizations of less than 1,000 members will be charged \$500.00 while larger organizations will be charged \$1,000.00 prior to February 1st, 2008. After February 1st, 2008, organizational rates will rise to \$750.00 for smaller organizations and for \$1,500.00 for larger organizations. Access is valid through 12/31/2008 for all webinars.

If you are interested and wish to try this service, for individual members, there is a trial access until December 14th 2007. To access and register for this trial, you need to do the following:

- Click on the [Archived Webinars](#) link on MetSIG.org.
- Select the webinar you want to register for and click on the **"Buy Now"** button (you can only register for one webinar at a time).
- Enter the **Promo Code TRINTRIAL**.
- Click on **"Update"** button and ensure that the total is 0.
- Click on the **"Checkout"** button.
- Complete the **required fields*** and hit the **"Submit"** button.
- The link to the webinar would be emailed to you
- Click on this link and you will now be able to play the requested webinar.
- If you wish to get your PDUs, you need to complete a survey for the webinar you review.

In the meantime, PMISCC continues in its effort to bring new value to our membership and are currently investigating other partnerships and arrangements while this trial is being undertaken.
